Arc of the Ozarks receives highest accreditation

ARC OF THE OZARKS

The Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) International recently announced that The Arc of the Ozarks has been accredited for a period of three years for its behavioral consultation services, community employment services: employment supports, community employment services: job development, community housing, community housing (autism spectrum disorderadults), community integration, community integration (autism spectrum disorder – adults), services for children and youth: child and adolescent services, services for children and youth: child and adolescent services (autism spectrum disorder- child and adolescents), supported living, supported living (autism spectrum disorder-adults), and transition services.

The latest accreditation is the 10th consecutive three-year accreditation that the international accrediting body, CARF, has given to The Arc of the Ozarks.

This accreditation decision represents the highest level of accreditation that can be given to an organization and shows the organization’s substantial conformance to the CARF standards. An organization receiving a three-year accreditation has put itself through a rigorous peer review process. It has demonstrated to a team of surveyors during an on-site visit its commitment to offering programs and services that are measurable, accountable, and of the highest quality.

The Arc of the Ozarks is a nonprofit organization with offices at 1501 East Pythian, and 1721 West Elfindale Street, in Springfield. It has been providing disability services for nearly 60 years in the Springfield, Monett, Joplin, and Kansas City area since 1964.
